Opening Words - Groups we belong to

All of us are a part of many groups: formal and informal – School and College Alumni, Yoga/walking/exercising group, Music/dance class group, Cousins group, Learning group, Travelling group, Society/Building complex group, Vedanta group not to mention the many WhatsApp and Telegram groups!

Some groups and what these represent are a part of our identity; these evoke warmth, pride and a sense of belonging and make us want to do more as a group. Some groups we belong to, because these enhance our status and position in society. Some groups we are a part of quite reluctantly, because we don't know how to exit them as egos may be bruised.

The Matha or Ashram is another group that our ancestral families have been a part of which may or may not be continuing today. Across the sacred geography of Bharat, there are numerous matha-s and $samprad\bar{a}ya$ -s, traditional lineages and centres of learning, blessed by the $devat\bar{a}$ -s and served by $Math\bar{a}dhipati$ -s, Gurus and $\bar{A}c\bar{a}rya$ -s. Even Sri Rama and Sri Krishna, despite being $avat\bar{a}ra$ -s went to learn at gurukulam-s (with Rishi $Va\acute{s}i\acute{s}tha$ and Rishi $S\bar{a}nd\bar{t}pani$).

Maṭha-s, Ashrams and Gurukulam-s as institutions and temples of learning are significant pillars of society. They ensure that wisdom and guidance on the *puruṣārtha*-s (*Dharma*, *Artha*, *Kāma and Mokṣa*) are shared with the community. Through *yajña-dāna-tapas*, everyday silently *Veda-pāṭhaśālās*, schools, hospitals, *gauśālā-*s, *annadānam* continue, sometimes without sufficient funds. But *Dharma* is to be upheld!

These institutions have existed for hundreds of years with the trust and devotion of kings, patrons and most importantly the $san\bar{a}tani$ -s who draw their strength from the guru they had or the matha they belonged to. Generations of Hindu families have been blessed by the lineage of $math\bar{a}dhipati$ -s and $\bar{A}c\bar{a}rya$ -s and they too have contributed to the dharmika activities of the $math\bar{a}$. Being a part of a matha (a kind of a group) ensures blessings and strengths our identity of belonging to something greater than us, which will continue long after we have gone.

The need for our support to *matha-s*, ashrams and gurukulams in Kali Yuga is more, not less! We see how we can strengthen our connection with them, learn and contribute. After all, it is one of the oldest groups that our families have been associated with!

In February, we will return to our beloved guru's ashram in Rishikesh for a Vedanta retreat after 6 years for an immersive learning experience. We will have the joy of seeking blessings

at Pujya Swami Dayananda ji's *adhiṣṭhānam*, which was not there earlier. Hope to see you there in person!

Wherever we are in the world, we will celebrate Mahashivaratri, united in our growing devotion.
